Somewhere Beautiful Natacha Diels

This performance is a journey into a strange landscape occupied by sounds and images that are at once familiar and unknown, reassuring and unsettling. The works are divided into three acts — a brief overview of life-to-death (*Somewhere Beautiful*), an unraveling of cohesion through incessant rigor (*Untitled Art Piece*), and a directionless journey to a long golden road (*The God-Fearing Woodsman*).

Somewhere Beautiful is a story that begins in the abstract with a long instrumental build-up, continuing through a breakdown of technology (or revealing a computer's soul), and culminating in a series of short descriptive snapshots of beautiful things.

The piece continues in *Untitled Art Piece*, performed on a controller that I built in order to harness the complex geometric patterns created by geared drawing machines. I interpret these complex patterns through a series of switches, converting the perfect geometry into imperfect yet cohesive musical structures. Accompanying the music is a narrative emergent from the shapes created by the drawing machine.

The final movement of the piece, The *God-Fearing Woodsman*, is both a commentary on the human ability to derive meaning from repetition, and an exploration for the meaningful. Throughout the piece, a whispered voice provides helpful advice ("Take a deep breath") and motivational words ("Reality can be like a fantastic hitchhike") that have no relevance to the situation at hand, suggesting an omnipresent societal disconnect.

Pushed into the sometimes dark moat between absurdity and reality, I don't know whether to laugh, cringe, or cry.

Text is a combination of self-authored, the Al Inspirobot, and quotes from Led Zeppelin, Martha Wainwright, and Tom Waits.
